Attendee Participation	As an attendee you have access to all content and programming within the platform.		
Browser and Technology Notes	 Important information: For optimal results, be sure to keep both your operating system and web browsers up to date. We recommend using a computer or laptop to view DO Day with one of these four browsers: Google Chrome, Microsoft Edge, Safari, or Firefox. The website is incompatible with Internet Explorer. Mobile devices, such as phones or tablets (i.e., iPads) can be used to access the platform and view sessions. iPhones and iPads should use the Safari Browser only, and Androids should use Firefox or Chrome. 	 Additional tips: Close unnecessary browser tabs and refresh your browser occasionally. Disconnect from your VPN. Stay close to your Wi-Fi device or use a wired internet connection. Can't hear? Check your computer sound settings and confirm the browser tab isn't muted. Login or access issues? Try refreshing cookies: In Chrome (on Windows, Mac, or Android) click the lock icon left of the website address, click Cookies, hit Remove for each, then hit Done. In Firefox (on Windows or Mac), click the lock icon left of the website address, Clear Cookies & Site data, then Remove. 		
CME Attestation	The link for CME Attestation is available on the platform (top of the home page). A reminder email will be sent out to all attendees. Attendees must keep track of the sessions they attended. Attendees are also able to save their attestations and add more sessions as they go but not submit the attestation until they are finished viewing all the accredited content they wish to view. Once the attestation is finalized, attendees will receive a certificate with the correct number of CME hours based upon the sessions they attested to attending. The conference is available on the platform until June 14 for CME course viewing.		

	Speakers who attend DO Day should plan to self-attest to all sessions that they attend (including their own, if applicable). If their session is eligible for CME, they will also automatically receive one additional speaker credit, and AOA Staff will issue a standalone certificate for that credit after the conference. CME Credits	Q: What is the difference between AOA and AMA credits? A: AMA PRA Category 1 Credit TM is typically allopathic CME while AOA CME is typically osteopathic CME. Both are equivalent. The physician should select which credit to claim based upon their own personal requirements with their boards, state licensure, etc.

iPad, iPhone, or Android Devices	 Attendees can access the platform through all current mobile devices. Android devices operating systems should be either version 6.x or later and should only use Firefox or Chrome. Apple devices operating systems should be up-to-date and should only use the Safari browser. Some older devices are incapable of having the most current updates and will be incompatible with the complexities of the site, but most modern devices will work fine. The mobile experience of the event platform can be accessed on a mobile browser. We recommend Firefox or Chrome. Here is the login link for this DO Day event: Coming Soon Users will land on this login page to login with their email address and gain access to the event. There is no password for the virtual conference platform. The mobile experience is completely responsive, so it will be the same format as the desktop view of the event.

Q&A in Sessions	Speakers will use the session chat feature to participate in Q&A. While there technically will not be a "live/verbal" Q&A after each session has finished, speakers or subject matter experts will be online in "real time" while their recorded content is playing to answer questions throughout their presentations. Live chat is only available during session broadcast time. Unmoderated Q&A chat will remain open through the duration of the meeting. If an attendee wants to ask the faculty a question after the broadcasted time, the attendee must click on the "email the speaker" link. This will send an email to the designated person who will respond.
Sessions: Live or On- Demand	Sessions will be pre-recorded and released as scheduled on the agenda. The content will be available for viewing on the platform until June 14. Note: All start times are in Eastern Time Zone.
Speaker Access to Platform	Speaker/moderator access is the same as attendees and will have all the same access and links as attendees. Speakers/moderators will access their presentations the same as an attendee. There is not a unique access link, waiting room, or anything different for speakers. Speakers/moderators are encouraged to enter their sessions 5-10 minutes before the scheduled start time.
Speaker Biographies	Speaker biographies can be found within the platform in the description area.
Technology	The DO Day 2024 virtual platform is best viewed on a PC or Mac computer with browsers such as Google Chrome, Safari, and Microsoft Edge. Internet Explorer is not compatible with this platform. Mobile devices, such as phones or tablets (i.e., iPads) can also be used to access the platform and view sessions. iPhones and iPads should use the Safari Browser only, and Androids should use Firefox or Chrome. Attendees should make sure they have the most current browser updates installed. Some older devices are incapable of having the most current updates and will be incompatible with the complexities of the site, but most modern devices will work just fine.
	 Network: For the best wireless connection, we suggest you stay in the same room as or close to your router or use a direct ethernet connection. Hardline internet is recommended over Wi-Fi. If using Wi-Fi, minimize its use by other people, close all unnecessary applications, place router in an open space, and turn on your cell phone hot spot as a backup. If using a work computer, disconnect from and do not use a VPN. Be aware of any firewalls. Sound: Can't hear? Check the sound level on your computer. Browser Audio, Video, Session Issues: Frequently refresh for updates. Refresh your browser with F5 Key (Windows) or Command + R (Mac). Browser Crashes: Clear Browser History/Cache with Ctrl+Shift+Delete (Windows) or Command+Shift+Delete (Mac). Also, make sure you don't have multiple tabs open while on the platform.

Time Zone	The DO Day program is shown in Eastern Time. Attendees can change the time zone setting for the virtual platform by clicking on their profile icon in the top right corner of the screen, clicking Profile, scrolling to the bottom to change the time zone option, and clicking Save Changes.
What does my registration include?	Registration includes access to two days of CME programming and Congressional meetings (for those who registered for that option) with 12-18 hours of programming available until June 17. The registration fee permits you to attest up to the maximum approved AOA Category 1-A credits or <i>AMA PRA Category 1 Credit</i> TM .
How is this different from previous DO Day on Capitol Hill events?	Similar to last year, DO Day 2024 contains both in-person and virtual components. The virtual conference is taking place on Saturday and Sunday, April 13 and 14, and in-person Congressional meeting prep in the afternoon of Wednesday, April 17, followed by a full day of in-person Congressional meetings in Washington, DC, on Wednesday, April 18. Attendees who wanted to participate in the in-person portion of DO Day must register by March 29.
	DO Day on Capitol Hill 2024 will focus on health policy education, leadership development, and advocacy training. The event will include learning tracks for physicians, affiliate leaders, and students. Our goal is to partner with our affiliates and state, specialty, and student associations to develop physician and student leaders to help cultivate a culture of advocacy for the whole of the osteopathic profession, with an emphasis on strengthening participants' understanding of health policy and advocacy skills that will support the development of and strengthen relationships with lawmakers.
	Over the past decade, DO Day has grown into a large event that relies heavily on student participation. DO Day is now being structured to improve our efficacy on Capitol Hill; it will also have dedicated learning tracks for students, physicians, and affiliates. Registration for Congressional meetings will be capped per state.
Why is there a registration cap per state?	Based on feedback received from participants in recent advocacy events and SOMA meetings, there is a strong consensus that Congressional meetings are more productive when meeting group size is limited. Building relationships with members of Congress and staff is critical to help advance health policy, and smaller meetings help foster better relationships with lawmakers. Registration for the Congressional meeting option for each state is based on the size of the state's Congressional delegation and state osteopathic association.
Do I make my own appointments? What happens if my schedule changes?	No, the AOA has partnered with Soapbox Consulting to schedule meetings on your behalf. Please do not attempt to schedule a meeting on your own as it could create complications for the Congressional office and the AOA. Participants should register for DO Day with the address at which they are registered to vote. The AOA's Public Policy team will match a participant's voting address against our congressional database to request appointments with your elected officials, and you will receive your schedule a few days in advance of the event directly from Soapbox.

How will I meet with my members of Congress virtually? Will I meet with my members of Congress personally?	DO Day participants will meet in-person and a few may meet virtually with their members of Congress or staff via video conference or telephone. The Congressional office has final say which method they prefer, so you may experience a mix between in-person, telephone, and video conference calls throughout the day. Members of Congress have very busy schedules. Between votes, committee hearings, and meetings with other constituents, their time is scheduled down to the

	or potentially controversial topics. This helps maintain the integrity of the meeting and ensures that DOs are seen as a knowledgeable and useful resource on health policy issues.
What are this year's legislative "asks"?	The legislative "asks" for DO Day on Capitol Hill will be announced as we get closer to the event. We want to make sure that we are advocating and presenting the most recent and up-to-date information to create a great impact on Capitol Hill.
I can't register because my state cap has been reached. How can I help?	Most of the DO Day material, presentations, and CME sessions will be recorded and made available after the event. In addition, we encourage you to join the Osteopathic Advocacy Network (OAN). Joining the OAN is free and is the best way to ensure your voice is heard on Capitol Hill.
	With the OAN, we'll continue to provide you with action alerts on legislation that could affect your patients or your practice. We'll also provide you with more ways to get involved – such as attending town hall meetings hosted by your member of Congress or attending one-on-one meetings locally with your representative or their staff. We also host monthly Public Policy Roundtables where you will meet with AOA Public Policy staff to discuss legislative updates. You can join the Osteopathic Advocacy Network here.
	Once states have reached their cap, in-person attendees are added to a waitlist and will be notified of any cancellations on a first come, first served basis.
	Another option is to register for the conference only to view all CME content. This registration option will not include access to the congressional meetings.
Why is space limited for advocacy meetings on Thursday?	Congressional meetings are more productive when meeting group size is limited. A smaller group size tends to facilitate more substantive discussions and provide an opportunity for more participants to speak.
How or when will I be notified if I've secured a spot to attend Advocacy meetings on Thursday?	The DO Day registration confirmation will inform attendees whether their registration includes Congressional meetings or if they are registered for the conference only and not Congressional meetings. Anyone placed on a waitlist for Congressional meetings will also be informed of that in their registration confirmation.
Can I attend only one day?	Participation in Congressional meetings is not required. Anyone unable to participate in Congressional meetings in Washington, DC, on Thursday, April 18, can still attend the virtual advocacy and policy conference on Saturday and Sunday, April 13 and 14. However, attendance on Wednesday, April 17, is <i>required</i> for anyone participating in Congressional meetings on April 18th.
